Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum Soulard Special Business District (Overview)

- Approved By Voters In 1994 As A "Special Taxing District"
 - Primary Purpose Is To Provide Enhanced Security For The District
- Funded 100% By Property Taxes
 - Not A CID Or TIF (Which Are Funded By Sales Tax Revenue)
 - Initial Tax Rate Set At \$0.35 Per \$100 Assessed Value
 - Current Tax Rate (2020) Set At \$.5619 / \$100 Assessed Value
- Hold Monthly Meetings Open To The Public
 - 2nd Monday Of Each Month, 6:30pm

Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum SSBD Tax Rate Structure

- Current Tax Rate (2021) Set At \$.5619 Per \$100 Assessed Value
- Future Tax Rate (2022) To Be Set By The Board In September, 2022
- Example(s) Of The Estimated Portion Of Your 2021 Property Tax Bill That Was Paid To The SSBD In 2022




Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum SSBD Historical Tax Rates



Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum SLMPD 3rd District Cooperation

Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum SSBD Security Patrols

- Utilizes SLMPD Police Officers (Carrying Police Radios And TCF Radios)
- All Officers Carry GPS (Used For Billing And Coverage Monitoring)
- Duties Include Patrols Of Streets And Alleys, Completion Of FIR's Of Suspicious Individuals, Escorts, Business Checks, Park Patrols
- Patrol Schedules Vary Throughout The Week ... And Are Guided By Intelligence From SLMPD re: Recent Crime Activity And Trends
- Patrols Occur Generally Between The 3PM To 3AM Timeframe ... With Varying Number Of Officers Patrolling At Any Time
- Utilizes Car Patrols With Dedicated Security Patrol Vehicle (Purchased By SSBD, TCF Markings)

Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum Security Patrols - TCF Impact

- Summary Of Notable Crime Incidents And Arrests
 - Total Number Of Shifts Worked By TCF Officers: 1,185
 - Total Number Of Arrests By TCF Officers: 17
 - Total Number Of FIR's (Field Interview Reports) Conducted By TCF Officers: 166
 - Total Number Of Felony Charges Initiated By TCF Officers: 57
 - Total Number Of Misdemeanor Charges Initiated By TCF Officers: 36
 - Total Number Of City Ordinance Charges Initiated By TCF Officers: 52

Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum SSBD and Soulard Security Camera Initiative

- Started As Collaborative Effort Of Soulard Special Business District (SSBD), Soulard Restoration Group, And Soulard Business Association. The Mardi Gras Foundation Provided Grant Funding For The Initial Phase.
- SSBD Funds The Ongoing Operation And Maintenance Of The Cameras.
- SSBD Operates 24 Cameras, Located In 8 Areas Of The Neighborhood.
- Cameras Are Located At Access Points, Key Intersections, And Certain Hot Spots.
- The City/SLMPD Operates A Comparable Number Of Cameras Around The Exterior Of The Neighborhood.

Soulard Neighborhood Safety Forum SSBD and Soulard Security Camera Initiative

- Purpose Is To Help Law Enforcement Investigations When There Are Serious Crimes Or When There Are Repeat Offenders Operating In The Neighborhood.
- Cameras Operate On The Genetec Software Platform.
- All Cameras Are Connected To SLMPD's Real Time Crime Center. SLMPD Can "Go Live" When There Is An Active Emergency Situation In The Neighborhood.
- SSBD Does Not Currently Have A Live Monitoring Program.
- Cameras Are Connected Via Dedicated Broadband Lines.
